The HARP Facility has developed an online, on-demand training platform to provide the humanitarian and development community in Myanmar with a bespoke, accessible curriculum for civil society organisations (CSOs) and small non-governmental organisations (NGOs).

HARP-F provides training and mentoring to partner organisations to build the resilience of local civil society actors and increase their capacity to prepare for, respond to and recover from natural and complex disasters. Since May 2018, HARP-F has trained 724 people from 154 CSOs and small NGOs across Myanmar on Emergency Preparedness and Response, Disaster Risk Reduction, Financial Management and Compliance with Safeguarding and Anti-Fraud/Corruption Standards. HARP-F training courses are designed to fit the requirements and needs of the CSO/NGOs, based on their self-assessment, and is highly context-specific.

When HARP-F ends this month, after five years of enabling national and local organisations to lead the humanitarian response, the platform will ensure this targeted, highly contextualized capacity building will carry on. The Emergency Response curriculum is the first training course available on the platform. This training is the only non-organisation-specific emergency response course available in Myanmar, and the only one delivered in Myanmar language, by local trainers, and specific to the Myanmar context.
